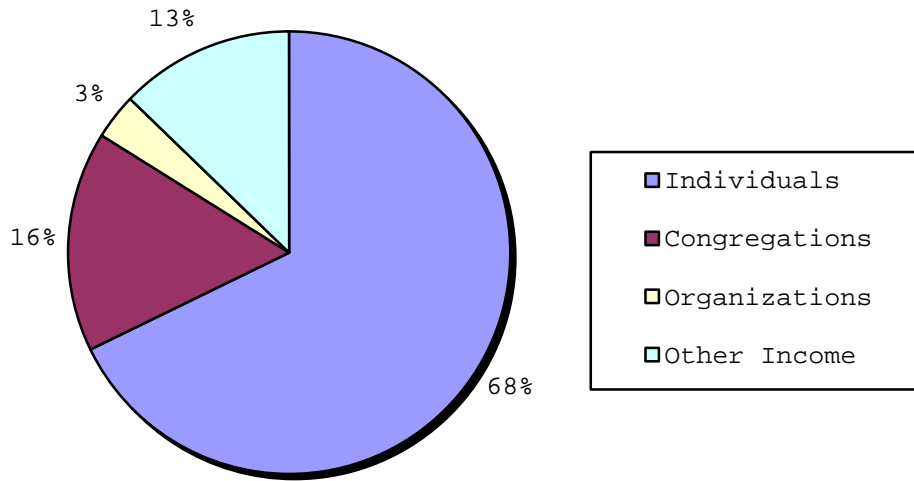

Jan. 1, 2007 - Dec. 31, 2007

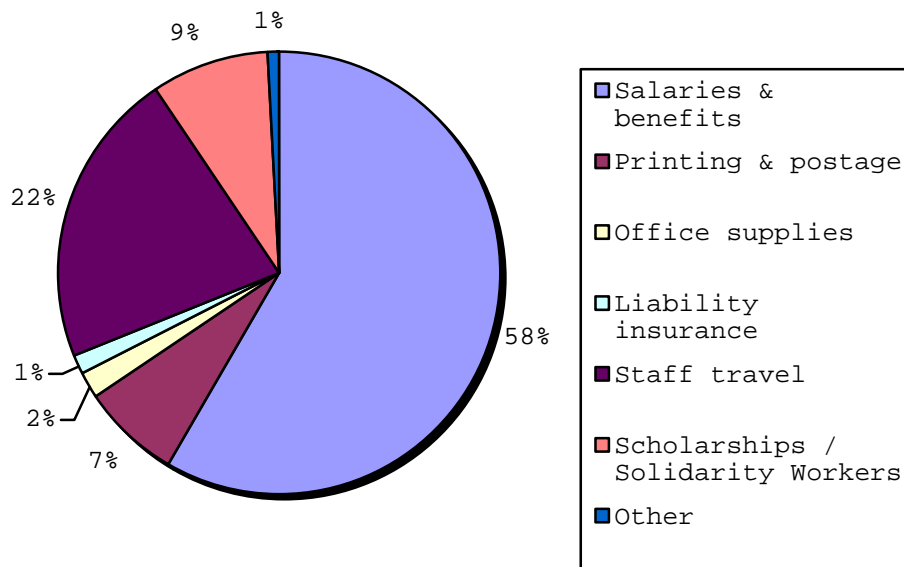
Sources of NCP Support

Total Expenses: \$69,500

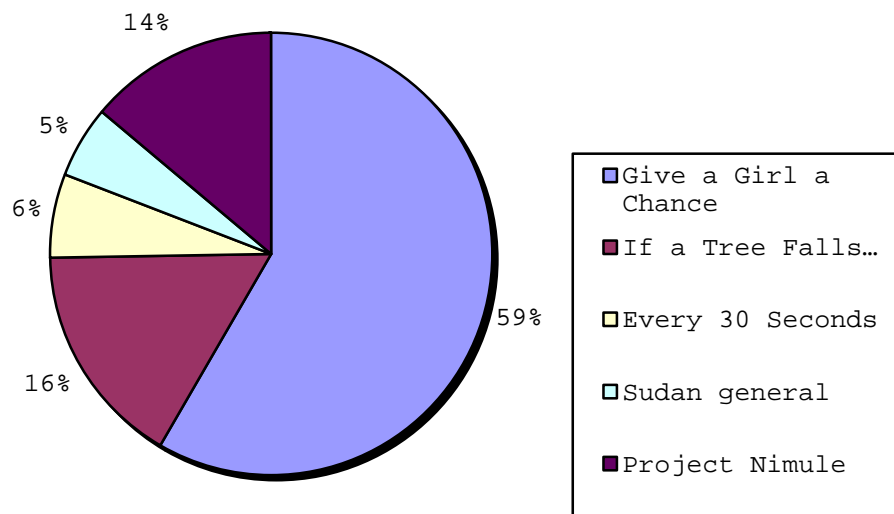


Thanks to all our supporters for making the work of New Community Project possible! As we feel a big obligation to use these gifts in a responsible and efficient manner, we

do everything possible to cut costs and maximize program. Indeed, NCP is nearly purely program! Here's a little more on how contributions were put to work to educate, motivate, and empower our network.

- Of salaries and benefits, 80 percent goes to provide staff specializing in presentations, resource development, and empowering individuals and groups - only 20 percent is for financial and administrative services. In addition, website development, graphic design services, and thank-you gifts for donors are provided free-of-charge by very capable folks in our network. And our Advisory Board serves uncompensated and typically covers their own travel expenses.
- The travel budget delivers staff to schools, colleges, and congregations around the country - where they typically stay in homes and generally live on-the-cheap.
- Office costs? Practically nil, as NCP staff work out of home offices.
- Even the printing/ mailing budget is primarily used for creating resources and sending out our three-times-per-year newsletter, *As the World Turns*, to some 4,000 recipients (two fundraising letters per year require around one-third of the printing/ mailing budget).
- In addition (and at very minimal cost) are e-newsletters sent to over 5,000 youth, young adult, and adult subscribers.
- Scholarships and support for Solidarity Workers help young people learn about and serve their world - and prepare for their future.

Special Funds
Total Income: \$53,425



When it comes to our Special Funds, 2007 was a record-setting year, with \$53,425 in donations. This brought the overall total since the funds were launched in 2003 to over \$144,000. After sending nearly \$25,000 in grants in 2007, this strong showing allowed us to continue - and even increase - the pace entering 2008. In the first two months of

the year, NCP forwarded grants of over \$37,000 for girls' education, malaria prevention, women's development, and reforestation. Additional grants to partner organizations in Sudan, Nepal, Burma, and El Salvador are planned for 2008. As always, NCP passes on 100 percent of Special Projects contributions to the projects themselves.
